



Farnborough International Sustainability Strategic Policy

A supporting document to the ADS Group Environmental Policy

Introduction

Farnborough International (FIL) is owned by, and part of ADS Group Limited. FIL understands and embraces the critical challenges posed by climate and ecological emergency and wider issues of sustainability. As an SME, whilst is not currently legally required to report on emissions, we recognise the importance of understanding our impact on the environment and reducing our carbon footprint through a carbon reduction plan. This policy sets out FIL's objectives along with the key commitments and the ongoing actions being undertaken to achieve them.

Strategy Statement

In line with the UK Government, UK events industry and the global aviation industry's net zero targets, FIL is committing to achieving net zero for all greenhouse gas emissions within its direct (Scope 1) or indirect (Scope 2 and 3) control as specified in the greenhouse gas (GHG) protocol by 2050 or sooner. Additionally, FIL aims to reduce these emissions by 50% by 2030 through its carbon reduction plan.

Policy Objective

FIL is committed to reducing its impact on the environment and strives to deliver a positive change, via its influence across the global aerospace, defence, space and security sectors, as well as the wider aviation and events industries. FIL is committed to its sustainability objectives whilst fulfilling its compliance obligations and ensuring best practice where practicable. FIL recognise that it is essential to develop a fully sustainable business, whilst supporting its clients in achieving their own goals and enabling the conversation to achieve the global aviation Net Zero target of 2050.

Commitments

- Aligning with the UK Government's goals to achieving net zero by 2050.
- Operating in a socially and ethically responsible manner.
- Following sustainability best practices to reduce greenhouse gas emissions at the source.
- Regularly monitoring and reporting of emissions for full transparency and accountability.

Carbon Emissions Statement

ADS Group and Farnborough International are currently not required to report under the Streamlined Energy and Carbon Reporting (SECR) framework on environmental matters (including the impact of its activities on the environment) or to report information on greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions. However, ADS Group and FIL acknowledges the importance and direct benefits in the measuring and reporting of their environmental performance, as well as remaining transparent to its clients and members. FIL will therefore do so on a voluntary basis.

Carbon Emissions Calculation

2023 will be referred to as the baseline year for its carbon reduction plan that will follow. These baseline emissions will be the reference point against which emissions reduction can be measured. From 2025 all FIL organised events and the venue will be carbon assessed separately, however will be included in the overall FIL business assessment.

The following calculation boundaries have been set and will be included in the carbon emissions calculation. This remains a work in progress.

Leased assets, office equipment, and purchased goods and services are not currently including in the current calculations and will be added in future reporting.

Carbon Reduction Plan and Future Projects

FIL will follow the principles of: **Eliminate – Reduce – Substitute – Compensate** to continue its progress in achieving Net Zero. Specific projects will be assessed for inclusion in this policy on an ongoing basis.

Declaration

Emissions will be reported and recorded in accordance with the published reporting standard for Carbon Reduction Plans and the GHG Reporting Protocol corporate standard and uses the appropriate Government emission conversion factors for greenhouse gas company reporting.





Scope 1 and Scope 2 emissions will be reported in accordance with SECR requirements, and the required subset of Scope 3 emissions will be reported in accordance with the published reporting standard for Carbon Reduction Plans and the Corporate Value Chain (Scope 3) Standard.
